CODE OF ETHICS

Purpose

To conduct oneself in a professional manner in such a way as to bring a positive image to the public and fellow members of the sport of stock car racing and to realize the need for a personal code of “unwritten laws”, since laws cannot cover all situations

Expectations

1. Respect must be had for all traffic laws and criminal codes as they apply to members, e.g. drinking and driving
2. No alcohol, drugs or stimulants allowed in Association with your car or team when in the public eye.
3. No verbal or physical abuse towards any person when associating with a stock car event, display, or promotion.
4. When dealing with the public, courtesy and cooperation should be shown to promote the sport in a positive fashion at all times, e.g. dealing with fans, sponsors, businesses, etc.
5. When in any public exposure, all members should be clean and presentable.

MISSION STATEMENT

“To provide members a motor sports and entertainment facility to showcase their talents and abilities, while providing our fans, corporate partners, sponsors and media a valuable entertainment experience.”

ARTICLE 1 – NAME

- 1.1 The name of the Association shall be the Saskatoon Stock Car Racing Association

ARTICLE II – OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Association are to:

- 2.1 Provide and promote the sport of stock car racing in the city of Saskatoon, the province of Saskatchewan and throughout western Canada.
- 2.2 Promote fairness and sportsmanship with the sport of stock car racing.
- 2.3 Promote the sport of stock car racing as a safe, legal and fulfilling alternative to street racing.
- 2.4 Promote the Association as a partner in the community.

ARTICLE III – INTERPRETATION AND DEFINITIONS

- 3.1 Masculine pronouns shall be understood to include the feminine gender.
- 3.2 Bylaws, wherever mentioned, shall refer to the most recent Bylaws of the Saskatoon Stock Car Racing Association.
- 3.3 For the purposes of these Bylaws, Saskatoon Stock Car Racing Association, Bridge City Speedway Inc., Wyant Group Raceway and Western Speed Association are considered one and the same. Membership in one includes membership in all.
- 3.4 Officers or Table Officers, wherever mentioned, shall refer to the President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer.
- 3.5 Board of Directors, wherever mentioned, shall refer to the President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer and the seven Directors.
- 3.6 Executive Committee, wherever mentioned, shall refer to the President, the First Vice President, the Second Vice President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, the seven Directors and the eight Junior Directors.
- 3.7 Members of Association, wherever mentioned, shall refer to the General Membership of the Saskatoon Stock Car Racing Association.

ARTICLE IV – ELIGIBILITY FOR MEMBERSHIP AND MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING

- 4.1 There shall be one class of membership.
- 4.2 Any person may become a member of the Association upon application and payment of membership fees and approval of his/her application by the Executive Committee. Any resolution of the Executive Committee admitting a person as a member shall be effective immediately unless such resolution has been set aside by members at a general meeting.

- 4.3 Any member may withdraw from the Association at any time by notice to the Association.
- 4.4 Memberships must be renewed annually and expire on the March 31 following date of purchase.
- 4.5 Members of the Association shall be entitled to attend and vote at all meetings of the Association and shall be eligible for election as Officers of the Association and shall be entitled to vote at the election of any or all offices of the Association and to enjoy all rights and privileges afforded by the Association members.
- 4.6 The annual membership fee will be established by the general membership. The membership may set a two-tier pricing schedule, with a lower fee for "Junior Members". Junior members enjoy the same privileges and voting rights as regular members.
- 4.7 Honorary lifetime memberships may be bestowed upon any person who has been a member of the Association for 25 years. Lifetime members enjoy the same privileges and voting rights as other members.
- 4.8 A membership interest of a member in the Association is not transferable and is terminated when:
 - a) He/she dies or resigns;
 - b) He/she is expelled, or his/her membership is otherwise terminated in accordance with the articles or bylaws of the Association;
 - c) His/her term of membership expires; or,
 - d) The Association is liquidated or dissolved.
- 4.9 The rights and privileges of a member in the Association, including any rights in the property of the Association, cease to exist when his/her membership interest in the Association is terminated.
- 4.10 Each member of the Association is entitled to one vote at a meeting of members.
- 4.11 The membership may elect Directors and Officers of the Association, specify their duties and delegate to them the powers the membership may see fit.

ARTICLE V – ANNUAL MEETING, SPECIAL MEETINGS AND REGULAR MEETINGS

- 5.1 The annual meeting of the Association will be held on the third Monday of October, commencing at 7:00 p.m.
- 5.2 The order of business at the annual meeting will be as follows:
 - a) Call to order;
 - b) Approval of Agenda;
 - c) Reading of minutes of previous meeting;
 - d) Business arising;
 - e) President's report;
 - f) Committee reports;
 - g) Nominations and elections;
 - h) New business;

- i) Notice of motions;
 - j) Giving notice;
 - k) Good of the Association;
 - l) Adjournment.
- 5.3 Notice of a special membership meeting shall be given at least 48 hours prior to the start of such meeting. Notice shall be by means of poster, advertisement, individual notices, individual telephone or SMS text notifications, social media and website notices as may be decided by the Executive Committee. No business other than that included in the notice of the special meeting may be conducted at a special meeting of the membership.
- 5.4 A special meeting of the Association may be called by the President as and when he/she considers it necessary, but he/she shall call a special meeting of the Association when requested to do so in writing by at least ten members.
- 5.5 Meetings of the general membership of the Association will be held on the third Monday of January, April and July each year. Notice of general membership meetings shall be given by means of poster, advertisement, individual notices, individual telephone or SMS text notifications, social media and website notices as may be decided by the Executive Committee.
- 5.6 During the race season, a portion of the driver's meeting at each race event shall be devoted to communicating information pertinent to the association's operations and information exchange from the Executive Committee.
- 5.7 Twenty-five (25) members shall constitute a quorum for the annual meeting of the association
- 5.8 For all other general meetings, special meetings and track meetings, members present shall constitute quorum.
- 5.9 The order of business for regular general membership meetings will be:
- a) Call to order;
 - b) Approval of agenda;
 - c) Reading of minutes of previous meeting;
 - d) Business arising;
 - d) President's report;
 - e) Committee and Treasurer reports;
 - f) New business;
 - g) Notice of motions;
 - h) Giving notice;
 - i) Good of the Association;
 - j) Adjournment.
- 5.10 Voting shall be by secret ballot in the case of election of officers, directors, junior directors and technical representatives, and by show of hands in other cases, except where a secret ballot is requested by at least three members.

5.11 Executive Committee Meetings

- a) The Executive Committee shall meet the first Monday of each month and at any other time as determined necessary by the Executive Committee.
- b) A special meeting of the Executive Committee may be called by the President, either Vice President or three other members of the Executive Committee.
- c) A quorum is present if 12 members of the Executive Committee are present in person.
- d) The order of business for Executive Committee meetings will be:
 - i) Call to order;
 - ii) Approval of agenda;
 - iii) Reading of minutes of previous meeting;
 - iv) Business arising;
 - v) President's report;
 - vi) Treasurer's report;
 - vii) Management/consultant reports;
 - viii) Committee Reports;
 - ix) New Business;
 - x) Swap;
 - xi) Adjournment

ARTICLE VI – NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, JUNIOR DIRECTORS AND COMMITTEE MEMBERS

6.1 Nomination

- a) Nominations for positions up for election will be received at the Annual General Membership Meeting in October of each year;
- b) Persons nominated must be members of the Association, in good standing;
- c) Persons nominated must be present at the meeting to accept nomination or may submit a duly signed letter stating their intent to stand for nomination.
- d) The positions of President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer and the seven Directors will be elected for two year terms, as follows:
 - i) The positions of President, Second Vice President, Treasurer and three Directors will be nominated and elected in odd numbered years.
 - ii) The positions of First Vice President, Recording Secretary and four Directors are to be elected in even numbered years.
 - iii) If any of the above positions are vacated during the term of the position, the balance of the term for that position will be up for election.
- e) Eight Junior Directors will be elected each year.
- f) A technical advisor for each division of racing in the Saskatoon Stock Car Racing Association will be elected each year.

6.2 Elections

- a) Nominations and elections will be conducted by the nomination committee.
- b) Nominations and elections will be held one position at a time in the following order, considering the positions up for election:
 - m) President;
 - ii) First Vice President;
 - iii) Second Vice President;
 - iv) Treasurer;
 - v) Recording Secretary;
 - vi) Directors (en masse);
 - vii) Junior Directors (en masse);
 - viii) Technical Advisors by Division.
- c) The name of each member nominated shall be posted in the order nominated.
- d) The chairman shall call for nominations a first, second and third time before declaring nominations closed.
- e) The name of each nominee will be read in reverse order of nomination and the nominee shall declare their intent to stand or decline for election.
- f) If more nominees stand than there are vacant positions, a vote by secret ballot will take place
- g) The nomination committee will decide on the form of ballot used and shall conduct the election.
- h) The ballots will be counted, and the winner declared before moving to the next position open for nomination. A simple plurality of votes cast will decide the winner. If a tie vote is declared, a run-off election will be held for the members with the tied votes.
- i) If no member stands for election for a position, the position will be declared vacant and may be filled by the Executive Board until the next Annual Meeting.

6.3 Removal from Office

The Association may, by vote of the majority of members present at a special meeting of members, remove any officer or officers from office.

6.4 Installation

All duly elected Officers, Directors and Executive Committee members shall be installed at the first Executive Committee meeting following election.

6.5 By-Elections

Should an office become vacant for any reason, the Executive Committee may appoint a member in good standing to fill the vacancy until the next Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE VII – EXECUTIVE AND DIRECTOR JOB DESCRIPTIONS

7.1 President

- 7.1.1 Elected for a two-year term in odd numbered years.
- 7.1.2 Is a Director of the Association.
- 7.1.3 The President shall preside at all general meetings of the Association, all Executive Committee meetings and all meetings of the Directors.
- 7.1.4 Is a member of the Budget Committee.
- 7.1.5 Is Chair of the Bylaws and Constitution Committee, made up of Directors of the Association.
- 7.1.6 Is an ex-officio member of all committees.
- 7.1.7 Is responsible for:
 - a) The organization of meeting, i.e. agendas.
 - b) All aspects for the efficient running of the Association and track.
 - c) To delegate duties as seen fit.
 - d) To be aware of what is happening in racing, in all classes throughout the racing community.
 - e) To ensure all duties are performed or arrangements have been made that ensures they will be performed.
 - f) Work with other members in the organization of special events.
 - g) Ensures timely and accurate information is relayed to the general membership.
 - h) General public relations on behalf of the Association.
 - i) Other duties as may be determined by the members of the Association.

7.2 First Vice President

- 7.2.1 Elected for a two-year term in even numbered years.
- 7.2.2 Is a Director of the Association.
- 7.2.3 Chairs the Budget Committee.
- 7.2.4 In the absence of the President, performs all duties of the President.
- 7.2.5 If the office of President falls vacant, be Acting President until a new President is elected.
- 7.2.6 Chairs the nomination committee, made up of Directors of the Association in the year their term does not expire.
- 7.2.7 Is an ex-officio member of, monitors and advises the Advertising and Promotions and Media Relations Committee, the Fan Side Committee, the Fund Raising Committee and the Volunteer and Member Relations Committee.
- 7.2.8 Other duties and responsibilities as may be determined by the members of the Association.

7.3 Second Vice President

- 7.3.1 Elected for a two-year term in odd numbered years.
- 7.3.2 Is a Director of the Association
- 7.3.3 Is a member of the Budget Committee.
- 7.3.4 In the absence of the President and the First Vice President, performs all duties of the President and First Vice President.

- 7.3.5 Chairs the nomination committee, made up of Directors of the Association in the year their term does not expire.
- 7.3.6 Is an ex-officio member of, monitors and advises the Buildings and Grounds Committee, The Competition Committee, the Ethics and Junior Program Committee and the Volunteer and Member Relations Committee.
- 7.3.7 Other duties and responsibilities as may be determined by the members of the Association.

7.4 Treasurer

- 7.4.1 Elected for a two-year term in odd numbered years.
- 7.4.2 Is a member of the Budget Committee.
- 7.4.3 Makes monthly reports to the Executive Committee including revenues, expenditures, budget variances and account balances.
- 7.4.4 Maintains general ledger for the various accounts of the Association.
- 7.4.5 Deposits all moneys received in the appropriate accounts of the Association.
- 7.4.6 Reconcile bank statements for the various accounts of the Association.
- 7.4.7 Ensures any expenditure is accompanied by supporting documentation, including approved vouchers, purchase orders, invoices and/or receipts.
- 7.4.8 Tracks and maintains records of accounts receivable and accounts payable.
- 7.4.9 Maintains a record of sponsorships and advertising accounts.
- 7.4.10 Provides all information and records to accountant for preparation of a year-end financial statement and financial statement at any time during the year if requested.
- 7.4.11 Is responsible for:
 - a) Track ticket inventories and reconciles ticket selling reports.
 - b) Deliver floats and pick up receipts for the concessions and the front and back gates.
 - c) Makes bank deposits.
 - d) Transfer money to appropriate account to cover prize money.
 - e) Make out prize slips.
 - f) Deliver cheques to the President for signing.
 - g) Pick up mail and distribute appropriately.
- 7.4.12 Other duties and responsibilities as may be determined by the members of the Association.

7.5 Recording Secretary

- 7.5.1 Elected for a two-year term in even numbered years.
- 7.5.2 Keep full and accurate account of the proceedings of all annual, general and Executive Committee meetings.
- 7.5.3 Record all motions, with the mover's and seconder's names, along with voting results, in the minute book of the Association.
- 7.5.4 Record all alterations in the Bylaws.
- 7.5.5 Answer correspondence and fulfill other secretarial duties as required.
- 7.5.6 File all letters, correspondence and communication.

- 7.5.7 Prepare and distribute all circulars and notices to members of the Association.
- 7.5.8 Obtain and send out sponsor passes.
- 7.5.9 Order and pick up supplies (tickets, trophies, etc.).
- 7.5.10 Maintain a record of membership in the Association and issue membership cards.
- 7.5.11 Other duties and responsibilities as may be determined by the members of the Association.

7.6 **Directors**

- 7.6.1 Elected for a two-year term. The terms are staggered, with four Directors elected in even numbered years and three Directors elected in odd numbered years.
- 7.6.2 Directors must have served as an Executive Committee member with a superior understanding of the operation of the Association.
- 7.6.3 Each Director shall chair a committee as assigned by the Executive Committee. These Committees include:
 - a) Advertising and Promotions
 - b) Buildings and Grounds
 - c) Competition
 - d) Junior Racing and Displays
 - e) Fan Side
 - f) Fundraising
 - g) Volunteers and Member Relations
- 7.6.4 The Directors are a watchdog group to ensure that all aspects of the Association are running properly.
- 7.6.5 Directors have the authority to monitor the finances of the Association.
- 7.6.6 Directors can review decisions made by the Officers and Executive Committee and suggest alternatives.
- 7.6.7 A Director or Officer may receive a reasonable indemnification for the expenses incurred on behalf of the Association as a Director or Officer, and a Director or member may receive reasonable remuneration and expenses for his/her services to the Association in any other capacity.
- 7.6.8 The articles are deemed to state that the Directors of the Association may, with authorization of the majority of members present:
 - a) Borrow money upon credit of the Association;
 - b) Issue, re-issue, sell or pledge debt obligations of the Association;
 - c) Give a guarantee on behalf of the Association to secure performance of an obligation of any person;
 - d) Mortgage, hypothecate, pledge or otherwise create a security interest in all or any property of the corporation, owned or subsequently acquired, to secure an obligation of the Association.
- 7.6.9 The Directors may, by resolution, delegate the powers mentioned in the preceding item to a Director, a committee of Directors or an Officer. This assumes that the powers of the Directors to do these things have not been restricted by the articles or Bylaws;

7.6.10 A majority of the number of Directors or minimum number of Directors required by the articles constitutes a quorum of any meeting of Directors and, notwithstanding any vacancy among Directors, a quorum of Directors may exercise all the powers of the Directors;

7.6.11 Other duties and responsibilities as may be determined by the members of the Association.

7.7 Junior Directors

7.7.1 Elected for a one-year term;

7.7.2 Is a member of the Executive Committee;

7.7.3 Each Junior Director is assigned to a committee chaired by a Director. These Committees include:

a) Advertising and Promotions

b) Buildings and Grounds

c) Competition

d) Junior Racing and Displays

e) Fan Side (2)

f) Fundraising

g) Volunteers and Member Relations

7.7.4 Assists the Director they are assigned to in the performance of their duties. This may include acting as chair of their assigned committee in the absence of the Director;

7.7.5 Other duties and responsibilities as may be determined by the members of the Association.

7.8 Attendance

If an Executive Committee member misses three or more meetings in a calendar year without just cause, the Executive Committee may remove that member from the Executive by resolution with a one month notice of motion. The Executive Committee will then fill that position from within or appoint another member from the general membership until the next annual meeting of the membership, by majority vote of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE VIII – COMMITTEES

8.1 Advertising and Promotions and Media Relations Committee

8.1.1 Committee membership consists of the Director and Junior Director appointed by the Executive Committee and any other members they determine necessary;

8.1.2 Develop and finalize an inventory of all items used in and available for advertising;

8.1.3 Develop a strategy to grow corporate, sponsorship and advertising revenue;

8.1.4 Develop an advertising strategy and budget;

8.1.5 Work with race teams to maximize their car sponsorship;

8.1.6 Organize appropriate functions for corporate sponsorships and partners;

8.1.7 Maximize corporate partner involvement in the track;

- 8.1.8 Develop relevant publications (race programs, brochures, tickets, coupons, etc.);
 - 8.1.9 Develop a public and media relations policy to maximize exposure;
 - 8.1.10 Develop a plan to ensure website is updated and current;
 - 8.1.11 Develop required advertising materials and ads;
 - 8.1.12 Work with Competition Committee and Fan Side Committee to develop race and event schedule;
 - 8.1.12 Other responsibilities as determined.
- 8.2 Buildings and Grounds Committee**
- 8.2.1 Committee membership consists of the Director and Junior Director appointed by the Executive Committee and any other members they determine necessary;
 - 8.2.2 Develop a maintenance plan which includes seasonal opening, closing and ongoing maintenance requirements;
 - 8.2.3 Develop a work party schedule to provide opening and closing of the track for events and rentals and ongoing maintenance requirements;
 - 8.2.4 Hire, direct and supervise a maintenance person as approved in the budget;
 - 8.2.5 Arrange necessary maintenance, repairs and improvements required;
 - 8.2.6 Other responsibilities as determined.
- 8.3 Competition Committee**
- 8.3.1 Committee membership includes the Director and Junior Director assigned by the Executive Committee and the Technical Advisors elected by the membership;
 - 8.3.2 Hold informational meetings with each Division to develop any rule changes for the upcoming season;
 - 8.3.3 Develop proposed rule changes for approval by the Executive Committee and presented to the membership at the January general meeting;
 - 8.3.4 Develop a technical inspection program which includes safety inspections of all cars and ensure all cars conform to the rules for their respective Divisions;
 - 8.3.5 Work with the Advertising and Promotions Committee and the Fan Side Committee to develop the race and event schedule for the season;
 - 8.3.6 Develop the race day schedules for each event;
 - 8.3.7 Ensure appropriate Officials, track, safety and ambulance personnel are in place for each event as required;
 - 8.3.8 Assign transponders for scoring systems and maintain records thereof;
 - 8.3.9 Maintain results, points and standings for race events and Divisions;
 - 8.3.10 Ensure two-way radios are charged and assign same as required for each race event;
 - 8.3.11 Maintain computer and network systems for the scoring system and standings;
 - 8.3.12 Other responsibilities as determined.

8.4 Junior Racing and Displays

- 8.4.1 Committee membership consists of the Director and Junior Director appointed by the Executive Committee and any other members they determine necessary;
- 8.4.2 Develop and monitor Junior Racing program;
- 8.4.3 Work with junior members, race teams and Competition Director to find appropriate placements for junior members;
- 8.4.4 Works with community groups to establish displays at events and businesses outside of the track. Schedules members and cars to be in attendance these organized displays or events;
- 8.5.5 Other responsibilities as determined.

8.5 Fan Side Committee

- 8.5.1 Committee membership consists of the Director and two Junior Directors appointed by the Executive Committee and any other members they determine necessary;
- 8.5.2 Monitor and update hotline;
- 8.5.3 Develop a season ticket campaign;
- 8.5.4 Develop and propose an admission pricing package for recommendation to Executive Committee;
- 8.5.5 Develop and manage contracts with the external vendors and service providers;
- 8.5.6 Organize and develop a policy for the provision of concessions, food services and catering services on the fan side of the facility and in the pits. Organize and develop a policy for the provision of alcohol services within the facility;
- 8.5.7 Hire managers for food services, alcohol services and catering as required and approved in the budget;
- 8.5.8 Develop a schedule and work with the managers to organize staffing as required;
- 8.5.9 Work with the manager to ensure required inventory is in place. Approver and forward invoices to Treasurer as required;
- 8.5.10 Ensure all licensing and approvals (Health, Liquor and Gaming) are in place for the season;
- 8.5.11 Work with race teams to have cars on display;
- 8.5.12 Ensure appropriate personnel are present, i.e. ticket sellers, ticket takers, security, ushers, etc.;
- 8.5.13 Develop a hospitality plan and manual;
- 8.5.14 Develop policies with regard to parking, signage, etc.;
- 8.5.15 Ensure appropriate announcers are in place for events;
- 8.5.16 Other responsibilities as determined.

8.6 Fundraising Committee

- 8.6.1 Committee membership consists of the Director and Junior Director appointed by the Executive Committee and any other members they determine necessary;
- 8.6.2 Develop and monitor fund raising opportunities;
- 8.6.3 Administers lottery license and 50/50 program;

- 8.6.5 Organize social events;
- 8.6.6 Plan and organize year end banquet;
- 8.6.7 Other responsibilities as determined.

8.7 Volunteer and Member Relations Committee

- 8.7.1 Committee membership consists of the Director and Junior Director appointed by the Executive Committee and any other members they determine necessary;
- 8.7.2 Organize and develop a plan to grow the base of volunteers for all areas of operation;
- 8.7.3 Develop a schedule and organize volunteers as required;
- 8.7.4 Develop a plan to reward volunteers;
- 8.7.5 Develop and monitor policies, guidelines and procedures for dealing with infractions and grievances of members;
- 8.7.6 Other responsibilities as determined.

8.8 Budget Committee

- 8.8.1 Committee membership consists of the President, the First Vice President, the Second Vice President and the Treasurer;
- 8.8.2 The First Vice President is Chairman;
- 8.8.3 Prepare an annual budget for approval by the Executive Committee;
- 8.8.4 Develop policies on capital planning, financing, reserves, etc.

8.9 Constitution and Bylaw Committee

- 8.9.1 Committee membership is made up of the Directors of the Association
- 8.9.2 Chaired by the President;
- 8.9.3 Reviews the Association Constitution and Bylaws and recommends changes.

8.10 Appeals Committee

- 8.10.1 Consists of the President, the First Vice President and the Second Vice President;
- 8.10.2 The President will appoint a Director to replace a member of the committee should any have to stand down due to conflict of interest;
- 8.10.3 Any member who faces a penalty or discipline by the Association (except a black flag during racing) may appeal that penalty or discipline. This committee will hear the appeal and issue a ruling, which will be final and binding;
- 8.10.4 The committee may refer any matter to the Executive Board, whose decision will be final and binding.

ARTICLE IX – VOTING OF FUNDS

- 9.1 Any expenditure not covered in the approved budget which is in excess of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) must be approved by the Executive Committee prior to the funds being committed.
- 9.2 Any project or expenditure that is “capital” in nature must be approved by the Executive Committee, even if already approved in the budget.

ARTICLE X – RULES OF ORDER

10.1 Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be the final authority as to parliamentary procedure, insofar as they do not conflict with any provisions of the Articles of incorporation, these Bylaws, policies or procedures adopted by the Board of Directors or the general membership or laws applicable to non-profit corporations and Associations.

ARTICLE XI – AMENDMENT

11.1 These Bylaws shall not be amended, added to, or suspended except upon approval by three-quarters ($\frac{3}{4}$) of members present at a regular or special membership meeting following at least fourteen (14) days' notice of such meeting.
